## **Preface**

The decentralization of Annual School Census in 2009/2010 was a complete departure of the past. Despite the fact, many states were skeptical of the change, Kwara still made a success of the programme.

The success achieved was not just celebrated by the State alone but widely exclaimed by the Federal Ministry of Education, Development partners and users of accurate statistics. It was on record that Kwara State was the only state that completed the Annual School Census cycle at the target time in August 2010 having conducted, reported, published and disseminated.

It was against this background that this 2010/2011 Annual School Census (ASC) was conducted. Care was taken right from the stage of training enumerators, field coordinators and supervisors to the conduct of the Census, data entry, data Query and data analysis. All the initial problems were overcome one by one with the support of ESSPIN. Luckily, the bulk of those officers that participated in the celebrated ASC 2009/2010 were still on ground, thus, the exercise was not too difficult though with some usual challenges.

The ASC 2010/2011 was conducted from 6th to 10th December, 2010, completed forms were returned on time. When the forms were screened however, some were either not completed or contained wrong information. The forms were returned for corrections before the data contained were enclosed. Data entry however witnessed some challenges because the period coincided with other equally important programmes; promotion of staff at SUBEB and recruitment of Science and Technical teachers at the TSC. Due to the experience and skills of EMISS officers handling the ASC, they were able to complete the ASC.

The efforts of the State Committee on Annual School Census headed by the Director Planning, Research, Statistics and Knowledge Management (PRS KM), LGEA and LGA Staff used as Enumerators and field Coordinators, Senior officers of the MDAs as supervisors and monitoring Teams facilitated the success of this year's programme too.

## **Executive summary**

The 2010/2011 Annual School Census which was a consolidation of the standard attained in 2009/2010 Annual School Census was conducted in November 2010. It contains information early childhood, Primary, Junior Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools.

It is interesting that more schools were captured at the ECD, Primary, Junior Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools, though the problem associated with capturing private schools still persists. Generally however response was high close to 99% but we discovered that about 15% of the forms were either not completed or wrongly filled. Thus, they were returned for proper completion before the conclusion of data entry.

Overall enrolment has increased across the pre-primary, primary, Junior Secondary and Senior secondary levels. The gender gap is however still relatively steady, that is about 49% female and 51% male. A detail study of the Census result however shows that while the girl child forms 49% at the Pre-Primary, it falls to 47% in Primary, 45% in Junior Secondary and 47% in Senior Secondary. There is a general improvement in the enrolment of children with special needs at both Primary and Secondary school levels by 31% and 71% respectively. The percentage of qualified teachers in public schools (84.2%) is higher than that of the private schools (72.5%). These percentages are however lower than what obtained last year which was 86% and 91% respectively. The pre-primary level has the largest percentage of unqualified teachers.

Provision of furniture, toilets portable water, blackboards and first aid kit in public primary schools are still as poor as last year. This lack of safe water also permeates into the Junior and Senior Secondary Schools with the later as low as just 30% of the Schools.

The rural – Urban dicoformies that cut across several aspects of the Schools system are still prevalent in the report. These include: Poor teacher deployment that leads to higher pupil – teacher ratio in remote LGEAs, wider gender gap and poorer infrastructural facilities and less integrated school Development.

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## **Definitions**

**Dropout rate by grade:** Proportion of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a given grade at a given school year who are no longer enrolled in the following school year.

To measure the phenomenon of pupils from a cohort leaving school without completion, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analysing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

**Gross enrolment rate:** Total enrolment in primary education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the eligible official school-age population (6-11 years in Nigeria).

To show the general level of participation in primary education. It indicates the capacity of the education system to enrol students of that age group. It can also be a complementary indicator to net enrolment rate by indicating the extent of over-aged and under-aged enrolment.

**Gross intake rate:** Total number of new entrants in the first grade of primary education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the population at the official primary school-entrance age (6 years in Nigeria).

To indicate the general level of access to primary education. It also indicates the capacity of the education system to provide access to grade 1 for the official school-entrance age population

**Net enrolment rate:** Enrolment of the official age group for primary education (6-11 years in Nigeria) expressed as a percentage of the corresponding population.

To show the extent of coverage in a given level of education of children and youths belonging to the official age group corresponding to the given level of education

**Pupil-teacher ratio:** Average number of pupils (students) per teacher at a specific level of education in a given school year.

To measure the level of human resources input in terms of the number of teachers in relation to the size of the pupil population. The results can be compared with established national norms on the number of pupils per teacher.

**Repetition rate by grade:** Proportion of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a given grade at a given school year who study in the same grade in the following school year.

To measure the rate at which pupils from a cohort repeat a grade, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analysing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.
